This being part of our Neuter and Release programme and KAR's initiative to control the population of unwanted animals humanely.

In November 2012 KAR moved into new office premises in which a large open basement looked an ideal place for the clinic and the dream began to become a reality. Funds were raised for partitions to be built and a group of volunteers were formed to continue to raise funds, source equipment and promote the clinic.



Donations of money, equipment, supplies and support were received and gradually the clinic takes shape. Our plan is to employ a qualified Veterinarian who can not only neuter and treat the animals in our care but could also mentor veterinarian students to be able to gain vital operational skills.
